7	E-motive (Oxfam Novib)	Projects in the Netherlands. Max. €50.000, and max. 75% of the project amount. E-motive links professionals' knowledge from developing countries with Dutch organisations. 8	Gered Gereedschap	Donations in kind (no financial funds), being restored 2nd hand tools and equipment for development projects worldwide. www.geredgereedschap.nl

5. Crowdfunding

Crowdfunding means fundraising amongst the crowd. The publicity around your project must be excellent and attractive to others during the whole process of a project. When people like your project and are moved by a picture, short movie or story they will share it (most likely through social media) with others and some amongst that crowd will give you a small donation. The support can be non-financial as well, such as free advise, get you into contact with others, do some voluntary task etc. Crowdfunding is new, hot and it may work if you make it work.

Advantage: if successful, a lot of promotion for your project and organisation. Plus the possibility for a (social media) coach; advise from experts; help for practical tasks from volunteers; feedback on the project from visitors. www.1procentclub.nl/projects/create
46	Crowdaboutnow	For Dutch entrepreneurs only. Crowdfunding as a loan that needs to be returned to the investors. Investments from €10 each. www.crowdaboutnow.com

	Fund	Characteristic
52	Sponsor activities	Known to all in the Netherlands I guess: sponsor run at schools; have an auction house for 1 day and the profits go to the project; organise paid activities for friends, family, school mates or colleagues, etc.
53	Businesses	A partnership with a business that have a common goal with your project. Think about a very smart and attractive project plan and proposal for partnership, since businesses get a lot of requests. Partnership can be: sharing knowledge, network, expertise, donations in kind, realise CSR goals; donations.
54	Self financing	Income generation from which the profit (partly) flows to your projects or organisation. Examples: coffee bar from DIR Foundation; Terre des Hommes sells 2nd hand clothes; sell services like workshops, clinics; hire office and meeting space in your office.
55	Income generating activities in project country	Income generation from which the profit (partly) flows to your projects or organisation. Examples: a temporary cinema in the townships that shows World Cup matches with a small entrance fee (Haarlem-Mutare City Link in cooperation with Breath Foundation); a fitness centre for a sport project (Mutare Haarlem Sportleaders); starting co-operatives not only for farmers to be able to sell and buy more efficient (IZERE).
56	Smart sponsor - partnership relations	Examples: Warchild has a 'donate your <i>airmiles</i> '- action. Smaller initiatives sometimes have an agreement with a local supermarket to have 1 days' gain from packaging deposit for their project.
